Dear Parents/Carers

Well what a year it has been! I cannot believe how fast we are approaching the end of session. I know this has been a tough year for everyone and I am very grateful for all your support as we have navigated our way through these uncertain times. Hopefully the new session will bring further easing of restrictions and we will be able to begin returning to something closer to normality both in school and in our wider life. However, we are not there yet and do need to remain vigilant as the number of cases does continue to rise across the country, including in our local area.

You will have seen in my letter last week the plans we have in place for the start of next session. If there are changes to this, I will let you know on the Inservice Day, Monday 16 August.

End of Session Celebration of Achievement

While we still cannot have whole school Assemblies and are not able to invite parents into school, there will still be 2 Celebrations of Achievement this week. Firstly, each class will have its own Achievement Celebration where they will reflect on the year and each child will be awarded a certificate for a personal achievement which has stood out to their teacher/s. Our second celebration will be a whole school one with each class in their own classroom and we will connect virtually. This will be in place of our traditional End of Session Assembly and a variety of certificates will be awarded. Look out for all of these coming home this week.

Gardening Help

During the 2 lockdowns our award-winning garden has suffered from neglect. Over this session, when we have been in school, the pupils have worked really hard to begin to bring it back to life and some order. We have flowers donated through the Community Council in the tubs at the front of the school and a variety of vegetables in the planters and tubs at the back of the school. However, we have REALLY missed our Gardening

Club volunteers, not only their time but also their expertise and enthusiasm has really been missed. Over the summer holidays everything in the garden flourishes, including the weeds! So, I am appealing to anyone who has any spare time over the holidays to come round and spend some time weeding or watering. Many of your children are great at knowing what needs to be done and it is a great way to spend some time outside with them. We have purposely not planted anything in the poly tunnel this season as this is more high maintenance but I would really appreciate your help with the outdoor vegetables and flowers.

Summer of Play

The Live Life Aberdeenshire Summer of Play / Holiday Recovery programme will offer a variety of activities throughout the summer, ensuring that all children and young people have the opportunity to participate. All activities will be free at the point of delivery and bookable online via the Live Life Aberdeenshire website.

The camps are open to primary age children (5 year olds must already have attended school) will run Monday to Friday with two camps each day - one in the morning (9am-12pm) and one in the afternoon (1-4pm).

Parents can book one session per day and all camps are completely free, thanks to funding from the Scottish Government.

I would urge you to enrol your child in some of these sessions if you can. One of the things we have noticed in school this session following 2 periods of lockdown is that many children have got out of the way of socialising in real life and have forgotten some of the skills essential for navigating and maintaining friendships and resolving various disagreements and problems that are a normal part of childhood. I know most children are tired and very much in need of a break but resilience is particularly low at the moment. Seven weeks, while a very welcome break from the normal school routine, is a long time not to practise these social skills and this programme of activities which Live Life

Aberdeenshire have organised is an ideal opportunity to get out and make new friends in a fun environment and it's all FREE. If your child has any support needs, whether in terms of medical, dietary or social skills, do let the organisers know when you enrol and when you drop them off, if they are aware of these they can support your child to gain the maximum benefit from the sessions.
