Homework

- All children will have reading homework 4 times a week. (This can vary depending on class activities.)
- P.1 Children will receive literacy homework on a Monday for the Friday and their new sound cards and actions are already in their book. The sound cards can be used as flashcards to help your child recognise their sounds. They can also be used to practise blending sounds together to make words.
- P.2 Children will receive literacy homework on a Monday for the Friday.
- A computer grid of relevant maths activities will be stuck into your child's reading record and the activities are optional.
- Your child may be given topic homework to do and details will follow.

Develop understanding and skills through the topic of 'Me and My Body'. This term we are focusing on the children learning about themselves, their families and each other.
