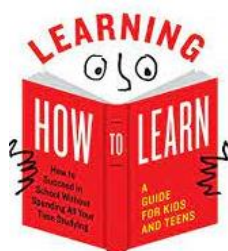

Library

Pupils are given the opportunity to visit our School Library on a Thursday morning when they can choose a book which they can read at home and in any free time in class. If your child still has a library book from last session at home please can they bring it in on Thursday.



School Bags

All pupils will be issued with a red homework bag, this is to keep any homework, reading records/diaries, reading books, library books and any notes that are

required to go home or be returned to school together, easily accessible and protected. All other items should be carried in your child's school bag. In particular tuck and water bottles should never be put in the red homework bag.

Achievements

As part of our work in school to raise pupils' awareness of their own learning, reinforce that learning is a lifelong process which happens in many places, not solely in school, and that the skills learned in one area can be transferred to activities or problems in another, we have an Achievement Wall to display, share and celebrate achievements out with school. Achievements can be anything that a pupil has been working towards and is proud of eg. successfully growing plants in the garden or independently riding their bike, not just when they achieve a certificate or medal from a club or competition.

If your child has an out of school achievement they would like to share, please email a photo of them taking part in the activity or showing off the final product to the school office with a short account of what they have done and why they are proud so we can display this on our Achievement Wall.

Remember if your child or someone in your household has symptoms please do not send your child to school, book a PCR test, isolate until you get your results and then follow the advice from Test and Protect. Please also let the school know if your child's absence is COVID related.

Carpark Safety

Just a reminder that, for safety reasons, parents should NOT be using the school carpark at drop off and pick up times. Please use the carpark at the Village Hall, the layby beside the park and, if needed, in the street but avoiding the yellow lines. Please also regularly remind your child/ren of good road safety practices and reinforce these when dropping off and picking them up.

Reporting to Parents

Unfortunately we are still unable to welcome parents in to school at present but we have been looking at ways to keep you informed of your child/ren's progress and development. A new Parents Evening Booking System (PEBS) which is compliant with GDPR and has video capability will shortly be available across all Aberdeenshire schools. We are planning on using this to offer virtual appointments on Tuesday 12 and Wednesday 13 October in place of our normal parent's evenings. We are also planning a welcome meeting on TEAMS for P1 parents on Tuesday 21 September, 1.15 - 2pm. P1 parents will be contacted separately with details of this.

We also plan to resume sending home pupil jotters at 4 points in the session, so you can see what your child has been learning in class and discuss their progress with them. Literacy jotters will be sent home first on Friday 12 November and should be returned on Monday 15

November. There will be an information sheet in the jotter to support you in your discussion with your child.

For those who are new to SumDog, including all our new P1s, your child needs to have completed a number of games before they can enter SumDog competitions. It is really important you let them have a go at these games by themselves as this is an adaptive platform and these games are used to assess your child's current understanding of different concepts before providing games at a level to support and challenge them. If you help them with these games, subsequent questions will be too hard for them.
