## Health and Wellbeing Week

We had a great start to the term with our whole school HWB week focusing on



mental health. Pupils worked in their mixed stage groups to produce a poster relating to a given emotion. Throughout the week we had a variety of activities from identifying different emotions and when we might feel them, where in the body we feel different emotions, behaviour as a way of communicating emotions, strategies to manage different emotions in ourselves and how to support others manage their emotions. We also took part in Yoga with Adriene to promote both physical and mental wellbeing you can access free yoga sessions on the link below. Following this, each group devised their own yoga flow to present to the whole school.

### **In Your Hands**

Due to the disruptions of the past couple of years many of you will be unaware that we have a link school in Nepal; Siddhartha Basic School, a small rural school similar in size to Auchnagatt. The link came about when one of our former pupils, Amber Cunningham, attended a presentation delivered by In Your Hands co-founder Pauline Sanderson. She was so enthused by the presentation that she persuaded first her family and then our school to become involved. IYH was founded following the devastating earthquakes in Nepal in 2015 with the aim of rebuilding 6 schools which had been damaged or destroyed. We raised money in school in a variety of ways, including the proceeds from our summer show. Amber's dad also raised money by taking part in 'The Highlander' mountain marathon, his work pledged to fund match our efforts. We were able to present IYH with a phenomenal total of £6000, far above the original £1500 originally pledged. This more than covered the rebuilding of Siddhartha School and helped fund their other developments.



Over the following years we had follow up visits from Pauline to give us updates on how Siddhartha School and the work of the charity were progressing. Unfortunately COVID impacted the work of the charity and the developments they were involved in. Now they are getting back on track and you can follow the progress on the links below: 2 teachers from Siddhartha School were involved in the latest teacher training -
