Homework

- All children will have reading homework about 4 times a week. (This can vary depending on class activities.)
- P.1 and P.2 Children have their literacy homework in their jotter already. The sound cards can be used as flashcards to help your child recognise their sounds. They can also be used to practise blending sounds together to make words.
- As per last term we would like the yellow homework jotters to be handed in on a Friday with an option to submit photos on Google Classroom.
- This term your child may also have maths or topic homework given on a Monday for the Friday.

How to help

As a little reminder homework should be a valuable, fun learning experience, therefore please help your child choose the best strategy for them, to ensure your child can gain the most from the activity. Remember to try some of the active tasks. These can be just as beneficial as sitting writing the words out. We all have our own preferred learning style.

This Term we aim to

Develop the children's understanding and skills of 'Weather'. This term we are focusing on the different types of weather and seasons we experience. We will be looking at recording and measuring the weather in and around our school. If you, or someone you know, can help us with this topic or may have items/books we could use, we would be delighted with any help.

In Maths we will develop our understanding and skills of addition to 10, 20 and beyond. The children will also be learning about Data & Analysis and programming.

In Literacy we will be focusing on:
 P.1 Recognising and writing sounds and common words and reading sight vocabulary. We will aim to increase the letters pupils can write independently and sound words out to attempt spelling in writing.
 P.2 Recognising and writing blends in words and learning common words and using this knowledge in our writing to achieve clever spelling. We are going to be using reading strategies to attack new unseen words and aim to use correct expression and punctuation. We will be working on questioning and written comprehension for understanding of text.
