We'll be setting up experiments to see what factors affect the growth of plants. Further to our learning about animal classification and endangered species last term, we're going to find out about animal communication and soundwaves. We will, of course, be making time to do some fun Christmas themed activities during the term ahead as well. In <b>maths</b> this term we'll be rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000. We'll begin some work on calculations and will discuss various mental strategies for addition and subtraction. Mrs Thomson will be continuing with shape position and movement.
