#### Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome back to the final term of the session. I hope you all enjoyed the Easter Break and were able to spend some quality time with your family despite the poor weather.

## Measure Collaborative Week



We started the term with our mixed stage Maths Week which was all about measures and based around the theme of Sports Day. We had 4 stations which the children worked on throughout the week. Weight: finding the individual and combined weight of the different equipment we use on Sports Day to decide how best to store it. Length: measuring the playing field to decide on the best distance for each race for the different age groups. Area and perimeter: measuring square and rectangular objects in our playground to practise working out their perimeter and area before working out if we have enough space on our netball court for everyone to take part in our Sports Day warm up. Volume: finding the volume of different containers and using this knowledge to make individual ice lollies to eat on Sports Day. Everyone now has their own, personally created, ice lolly to enjoy during the break on Sports Day. All we need now is good weather!

There is a change to the format this session due to the festival overrunning in previous years with later events being abandoned. Unfortunately, this means the festival is now aimed at P6 & 7 pupils this year with P5 pupils only able to enter where there are spaces in the P6 team. Pupils will compete in a range of track and field events alongside pupils from other schools in the Mintlaw Network. More details to follow.

#### **Techfest**

All 3 classes have applied to attend Techfest: festival of science, technology, engineering and maths, again this year. This is usually a super trip which greatly benefits the children. We waiting to hear if we have been successful.

## School Show

I am very excited to let you know that we will be putting on a school show at the end of this term. Following the success of our collaborative arts week last session using materials developed by Sky Arts, we are again holding our arts week in June. This year the theme is 'Connection' and will include virtual input from a variety of artists under the headings of Mark Making, Words, Images, Moves and Sounds. These collaborative weeks where the pupils work in mixed age groups are so valuable in developing many transferrable life skills as well as the curricular skills and knowledge which they are based around.
